

Accomplishments of CEDRIC DEAN

- Transformed the lives of thousands of prisoners who have attended Cedric's classes, seminars, and programs, based on the testimonies of letters received by Cedric from federal prisoners, correctional staff, public officials and parents.
- Wrote eight transformative anti-violence, anti-gang and anti-drug curriculum books for children and teens (Cedric Dean's New Life Curriculum), a series that deals with overcoming peer pressure, misguided thoughts, anger management and bullying.
- Wrote the "Cedric Dean's Protocol for Saving America's Youth: A National Solution to Crime, Drugs and Violence," which provides step-by-step prevention and intervention practices, as well as special insight and attention to promising solutions to juvenile delinquency and criminal street gang activity.
- Wrote the "Cedric Dean and Shannon Dycus Manifesto for Saving Abused Children," which provides step-by-step prevention and intervention practices on how to help abused children live more positive and productive lives.
- Wrote letters to at risk youth that have been used as counseling and learning tools by churches, organizations and social media outlets. The letters are available for free on his website.
- Wrote "How to Stop Your Children from Going to Prison," a book that have been used in Federal Bureau of Prisons' adult continuing education parenting classes.
- Collaborated with the Federal Bureau of Prisons in the creation of an inmate organization called RISE - Rehabilitate Integrate Stimulate Educate, a replica of Cedric's SAVE (Safeguard Atone Validate Educate) program. RISE is proving to be so inspirational that it, too, is saving lives.
- Provided live mentoring to very high security prisoners who attended Cedric's "Leader Breed Leaders" seminars, based on his 'Leaders Breed Leaders' book, which offers 7 keys to effective leadership.
- Received from the Federal Bureau of Prisons a 2011 Call to Service Award for his volunteer efforts to help rehabilitate prisoners.
- Received from the USP Lee Education Department Civil Service Award for his mentorship and leadership of his fellow prisoners.
- Received his Teacher Assistant certification from the U.S. Department of Labor, as well as hundreds of other awards and certificates while incarcerated.
